DESCRIPTION

Elevator Constructors assemble, install, repair, modernize and maintain electric and hydraulic freight and passenger elevators, escalators, moving walkways, material lifts, wheelchair lifts and dumbwaiters.

Elevator Constructor Training offers a series of classes which include Safety for Elevator Constructors, Fundamentals of Print Reading, Handling Materials & Tools, Rigging & Hoisting, Hydraulics and more. This training is administered through the National Elevator Industry. NEIEP is the standard for the entire Elevator Industry.

Requirements for graduation of journeyman include a series of classes, such as DC Motors and Generators, Solid State Theory & Application, Microprocessor Controls, etc. NEIEP ensures that IUEC Mechanics will be ready and able to meet the challenges created by technological changes in the industry through the Mechanic's Technical Review Series.
